Outgoing President, Pam Robinson's 2013 - 2014 Report to the AGM, 20 JUNE 2014

I have thoroughly enjoyed my role and working towards the development of a vibrant Branch at the Top End of the nation. I would like to thank the outgoing



Executive for their participation and their support of me and our Association while we all worked towards making 2013-2014 an interesting and useful year.

I would also like to thank the City of Palmerston CEO and Mayor especially for their appreciation of my role as President of ALGWA NT and for making every opportunity available to me as President of our Association. Both have actively

promoted ALGWA NT. From the CEO's office, the circulation of each edition of the ALGWA NT Newsletter has been sent to All Staff. Through this alone, more staff have joined ALGWA NT. Thank you LGANT also, for taking up my ask that ALGWA information go out to Councils through their newsletter 'This Week @LGANT'.

Here are some of the highlights from the year with the other contacts and happenings from the year appearing in the by-monthly Newsletter which was produced and circulated during the year to all Members and many others such as Ministers for Local Government, other Member of Government and Opposition Government Members, LGANT, the LGMA NT Division Executive, the National Board of ALGWA and various other interested parties.

Activities throughout the year:

JULY 2013

1. Following the AGM in June 2013 a meeting between the Presidents of ALGWA NT and LGMA NT was initiated and the idea of a joint soiree was hatched to take place later in the year.
2. ALGWA NT and the Office of Women's Advancement made the link to have both organisations better known to each other, with the ALGWA website going onto the NTG hub and placed on their Facebook.

AUGUST 2013

1. Arrangements developed for two November ALGWA & LGMA social functions to be held.
2. Attendance at the Australian Institute of Management promoting ALGWA NT.

NOVEMBER 2013

ALGWA NT Branch joined with the Local Government Managers Association, Northern Territory Division, providing a social networking opportunity for current and new members within both organisations. With a view to always making such events available to the most people, the opportunity of the LGANT

conference taking place in Alice Springs at that time was chosen for one of the events.

1. Alice Springs 10 November: Alice Springs Town Council provided the venue and their CEO welcomed everyone to the Town. A small and interested number were able to be present and the event, which was held after the LGMA NT Division AGM. However, due to several other dinner meetings also on during the same evening and in an around the LGANT conference it tended to undo the opportunity of choosing that time for our event.
2. Darwin 25 November: Darwin City Council provided their Function Area of Council for the evening soiree. Again, not large numbers present but a great atmosphere and well worth promoting the two Local Government Organisations. We achieved some renewal of subscriptions along with gaining some new memberships. The Lord Mayor of the City of Darwin and Mayor of the City of Palmerston welcomed guests.

DECEMBER 2013

The ALGWA NT Newsletter, January edition went out thus tripping the 'every other month' to work well for events that were coming up and to take us through to the AGM in June.

FEBRUARY 2014

1. February ALGWA NT Annual Breakfast

ALGWA National President Kathy Benstead accepted the NT Branch invitation to attend.

As President of the NT Branch, I thank both Kathy and the National Executive for making it possible to have an official Territory Presidential visit a reality. The location of Il Lido Restaurant at the Darwin Waterfront provided good food, a cheerful venue both of which ensured a good attendance. The Lord Mayor and CEO of the City of Darwin, along with the Mayor and CEO of the City of Palmerston were in the audience.

John McNeur Regional Development Officer, Volunteering SA&NT was the Guest Speaker and he gave some excellent information and provided very good reasons as to why local government should engage volunteers through their organisation as well as heralding volunteers 'in general'. His line "statistics show that those local governments that encourage and promote volunteers within their ranks, have a community that better understands and supports their local government" struck a chord.

2. February Meeting with Minister for Local Government and Regions the

Hon. David Tollner MLA.

As ALGWA NT President, I was invited by the Minister of Local Government and Regions, David Tollner MLA to meet with him and his CE of his Department, Allan McGill to provide information about the work of ALGWA NT; Councils for Gender Equity and which Councils held Bronze and Silver level and that the City of Darwin was 'going for gold'.

3. February, Meetings with CEO LGANT, CEO's City of Palmerston and City of Darwin to progress discussion on the opportunity for the NT Local Government Councils to promote 50:50 Vision and 'get started' and for other Councils to progress from Bronze level to Silver level and also to encourage the City of Darwin to 'go for gold'.

Additionally, advice from both CEOs of the adjoining cities confirmed the City of Darwin will work towards the Gold Level and City of Palmerston will, later in the year, undertake requirements of the Silver Level in the Council for Gender Equity Program.

Also in attendance at those meetings along with the National and Territory ALGWA Presidents Kathy and Pam, was Vice President ALGWA NT Clair O'Brien. At the City of Palmerston, Executive Members, Alderman Sue McKinnon joined us and at the City of Darwin, Alderman Helen Galton was in attendance.

MARCH 2014

Vice President Clair invited me as President of ALGWA NT to accompany her to the Rural Industries Research and Development Corporation, Rural Woman of the Year Award NT at Parliament House. Discussions with several attending provided an opportunity to showcase the Association and talk about the Council in their region.

ALGWA NT represented at the International Women's Day Parade.

From this participation came renewed discussion on the matter of ALGWA NT having its own Banner to march behind and to have available for other events. (Today we have the Banner which has been achieved through a donation from Lord Mayor Katrina Fong Lim) Thank you Lord Mayor.

APRIL AND MAY 2014 were months of many public holidays and busy commitments, so whilst no specific public events were undertaken due to both these aspects, the ALGWA NT Executive Committee meet as did the National ALGWA Executive.

JUNE 2014

Extract from Hansard on 10.6.14 shows ALGWA NT and 50:50 Councils for Gender Equity mentioned. Questions came from Lynn Walker, Member for Nhulumbuy and Shadow Minister for Local Government to the Minister for Local Government and Regions, Minister David Tollner MLA.

Both Question and Response appreciated and provides the opportunity for further communication between both Government and Opposition in the NT.

Meetings of ALGWA National Executive 2013-2014

During the year, as President ALGWA NT and the delegate to the National Executive, I attended the National Executive Ordinary Meetings in November and February. Where Items required response between meetings, this was attended to through emails and in the form of a Flying Minute process – in other words a quick response by return.

The National President Kathy and National Secretary Karen and National Treasurer Alwyn provided a wonderful year of support and active business routine to ALGWA whereby all the States and the Northern Territory delegates achieved a great deal together in the past year for the Association.

My attendance at the meetings has been through Telephone link-up and there have been three meetings attended to this way during the twelve months.

The Annual General Meeting on Saturday 23 November, was attended to through Telephone link- up by Vice President Clair as proxy for me as President of

ALGWA NT.

Business included a review and updating of the ALGWA National Constitution, the setting of the 2013/2014 subscription fees be set at 35% of the Branch fees collected, review and updated advice to meet the requirements of the 50:50 Vision – Councils for gender equity which will encourage more Councils to participate, work on the Strategic/Corporate Plan, and a review of the ALGWA National Conference Guidelines.

ALGWA NT has provided the National President and Secretary the most current information of Mayors and Presidents in the NT (November 2013) and Council Contact information of senior officers for the purposes of the picture across the nation of women in local government with work being undertaken by LGQA with the 50:50 Gender Equity Program.

National ALGWA matters of general interest were transmitted to ALGWA NT Members through our Territory Newsletter.

The next meeting for ALGWA National Executive is Monday 25 August with the final one for 2014 on Monday 24 November. The morning teleconference time will confirmed in due course.

Following our AGM today the name of our new President and Secretary will be forwarded to the National Secretary to update the National Executive (all States) Contact details.

We will not I think ever be a big organisation in the NT, numbers wise, but certainly there is room to grow both our membership and the activities we undertake. Regardless of size, what I believe is, we are and can increasingly be a most useful organisation for elected and officer members of local government and to foster greater interest in local government generally within the community.

Additionally there is the opportunity for us to continue providing an insight to students to consider local government as a future employer of choice - there is the opportunity to promote local government within youth organisations - particularly to those showing leadership skills already within those organisations and who could be encouraged to stand for election in future years - and there is always the continuing opportunity to link all levels of those working with different aspects of local government, between elected and officer and within different local government organisations.

It was not possible to fit another social event into during April- May due to everyone's heavy commitments. However, that just means it can be 'on the table' for discussion in the new ALGWA NT year and consideration of a good fundraising event should be considered so as to bolster our bank account. It is also time 'again' to contact all Councils to encourage their staff to join ALGWA . It is time too to find a location where our records can be kept as one Executive transfers to another.

So in closing my Report, I would like to again say thank you all for the privilege of being President of ALGWA NT for the past two years.

I wish the new President and the incoming 2013-2014 Executive an interesting and successful year. Thank you, City of Darwin for making your Chamber available for our AGM today. I will make my Report available to all our Members through the August edition of our Newsletter.

August Profile: ALGWA NT Treasurer Alderman Kate Worden



I was born and raised in the UK, immigrating to Adelaide for my dad's employment when I was 13. I spent my teenage years attending Unley High School and made my first trip to the NT in 1984 where I found myself living in Ngukurr in a shed, through the wet season. A few years later I moved to Katherine but returned to Adelaide in the early 90s where I gained a Bachelor of Indigenous Affairs at UniSA. I have also gained formal qualifications in negotiation and Commercial Studies. I made my last and permanent move to the Territory in

1995 with my partner, Wayne seeking employment opportunities on a 5 year adventure!

I joined the NT Government later that year and I helped Wayne establish a small painting business. We have never looked back. I have worked in the Departments of Mines, Education and Health, the Office of Consumer Affairs and headed up the Secretariat at the Department of Children and Families. I was fortunate to spend 8 years as a Political Adviser to the former Labor Government advising on matters ranging from sport, to Employment and Training, Women's policy, and Worksafe.

On a personal level, I co-founded the Waratah Netball Club in 1998 and have sat on the Waratah Football Club Board for 3 years as Secretary. I was the President of the Pints Football Club for 4 years and continue to play and volunteer with my netball club. I have been on the Wanguri and Jingili School Councils and am a regular Seabreeze Festival volunteer.

I have four great kids and two beautiful granddaughters. Tarrise lives in New Zealand and is an Indigenous artist, Sarrita lives in Canberra and is an Indigenous Artist running her own art gallery, Russell is in IT and works for a local business, and our baby Alekna attends Nightcliff Middle School, sings, and is a long term member of Corrugated Iron. I continue to support Wayne with his painting business and he enjoys playing Masters AFL after a long period playing and coaching in the AFLNT.

This is my third year as an Elected Member on the City of Darwin Council and I have been fortunate enough to have the opportunity to Chair the Community and Cultural and Arts and Cultural Development Committees for the last 14 months. I represent LGANT on the Board of Neighbourhood Watch NT, and am a member of the Anchorage Sister Cities committee.

In my day job, I am the Director of Compliance at the Department of Housing and this year I am lucky enough to be heading to ANU for a week after being awarded a partial scholarship on the Excellence in Local Government Leadership Program run by ANZOG.
